
The Carleton Island Federal Anchorage is a designated maritime zone located in the St. Lawrence River near Cape Vincent, New York. Officially established by the U.S. Coast Guard in July 2018, the anchorage was primarily created to improve safety and traffic flow in the Thousand Islands region.

Its main functions include serving as a Pilot Wait Zone, providing a safe area for bulk freight ships, tankers, and tugs to wait for a pilot to come aboard. This helps manage the queue of commercial ships traveling to and from the St. Lawrence River and Lake Ontario.

While the locks remain operational, significant end-of-season restrictions and draft issues have increased usage of the anchorage. Recently, as many as seven ships at a time have remained in the anchorage for several days each between Christmas and New Year's.

Since Christmas Eve, there have been as many as 7 ships at anchor between Carleton and Linda Island.

TIDBITS FROM THE TOWN

Many of our community members rely on the What's Happening newsletter to stay informed about local activities. In that same spirit, we are pleased to join the Mayor in sharing updates that help keep everyone aware of what's going on at the Town Offices.

Following the November elections, there were several changes in your Town's elected leadership. On behalf of the Town Board, I would be remiss if I did not recognize our outgoing Town Supervisor, Paul Aubertine, and our outgoing Town Clerk, Michelle Bouchard, for their many years of dedicated public service. Michelle has earned a well-deserved retirement, and Paul will continue serving the community through his work on the dairy farm and his ongoing involvement in local activities. We thank them both sincerely for their commitment to our Town.

Your new Town Board was officially installed on January 1st during a brief ceremony at the Town offices, and wasted no time getting to work. Immediate priorities include the next phase of Water District No. 7, managing three open New York State waterfront revitalization grants, and several staffing adjustments. The Board's initial focus will be on streamlining processes, improving communication, and information sharing, both internally and with the community.

To help manage the workload and ensure informed decision-making, each Council member will serve as a liaison and subject-matter lead in specific areas. This approach is intended to keep both the Board and residents well informed and engaged.

As the new Town Supervisor, I plan to hold regular office hours Tuesday through Thursday, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., with evening appointments available as needed. Please feel free to contact the Town Office if you would like to meet individually to discuss Town business or ongoing activities.

Our regularly scheduled Town Board meetings will continue to be held on the third Thursday of each month, with work sessions on the first Thursday. Please note that the meeting time will now begin at 6:00 p.m.



These are exciting times for our community. The Town Board looks forward to serving as your representatives and working together with residents in the months ahead.







Notes from the Mayor

As the year drew to a close, the Village Board received welcome news: the Village has been approved for a New York State Water Infrastructure Grant. This award represents the second major step in securing funding to address the aging water infrastructure hidden beneath our streets. Our goal is to continue advancing this funding process so construction can move forward at the same time as the NY Forward Streetscape project. Coordinating these efforts would mean one construction period downtown instead of two - saving both money and inconvenience for residents, businesses, and visitors alike.

Speaking of NY Forward, progress is also underway on the Streetscape and Club Street projects. A newly formed Project Advisory Committee has begun working closely with the Delta Engineering and Design team to develop design options for our downtown. Community input will be an important part of this process. This Advisory Committee is made up of local residents and business owners who represent a cross section of the community. The public will have opportunities to review and comment on proposed designs through an online platform and at an in-person public forum planned for March and April. Additional details will be shared in the coming weeks on the Village website, local newspapers, and in the What's Happening newsletter.

A huge shout out got our DPW team who's dedicated efforts at snow clearing started early this season and show no signs of letting up as winter continues to blanket the North Country. If you see our guys out there after hours and weekends, a quick wave and thanks go along way to warm up their spirits in freezing temperatures!

Latest update on the International Ferry. More good news here. The Mayor of the Frontenac Islands announced that they had closed on a real estate purchase of the Ferry Landing on Wolfe Island. This brings everyone a step closer to a functioning ferry between the United States and Canada. Of course, the biggest challenge remains the operation of the Ferry itself, but as reported in the local news and other public sources, there is a great deal of work being done to bring this to fruition.

We are continuing our pursuit of Electric Car (EV) chargers in conjunction with the Local Development Corporation (LDC). These chargers would be placed in the area behind the Chamber of Commerce office and would provide several chargers in an updated public parking area. Like any project, the board is committed to seeking outside funding to ensure the financial burden is not placed solely on our Village taxpayers.

Looking ahead, the Village Board also plans to begin a review of the Village Zoning Regulations later this year. Early feedback from community members has already helped identify areas for consideration, and we encourage residents to continue sharing thoughtful, constructive input. Your ideas and perspectives will help guide updates to this important document and shape the future of our Village.
